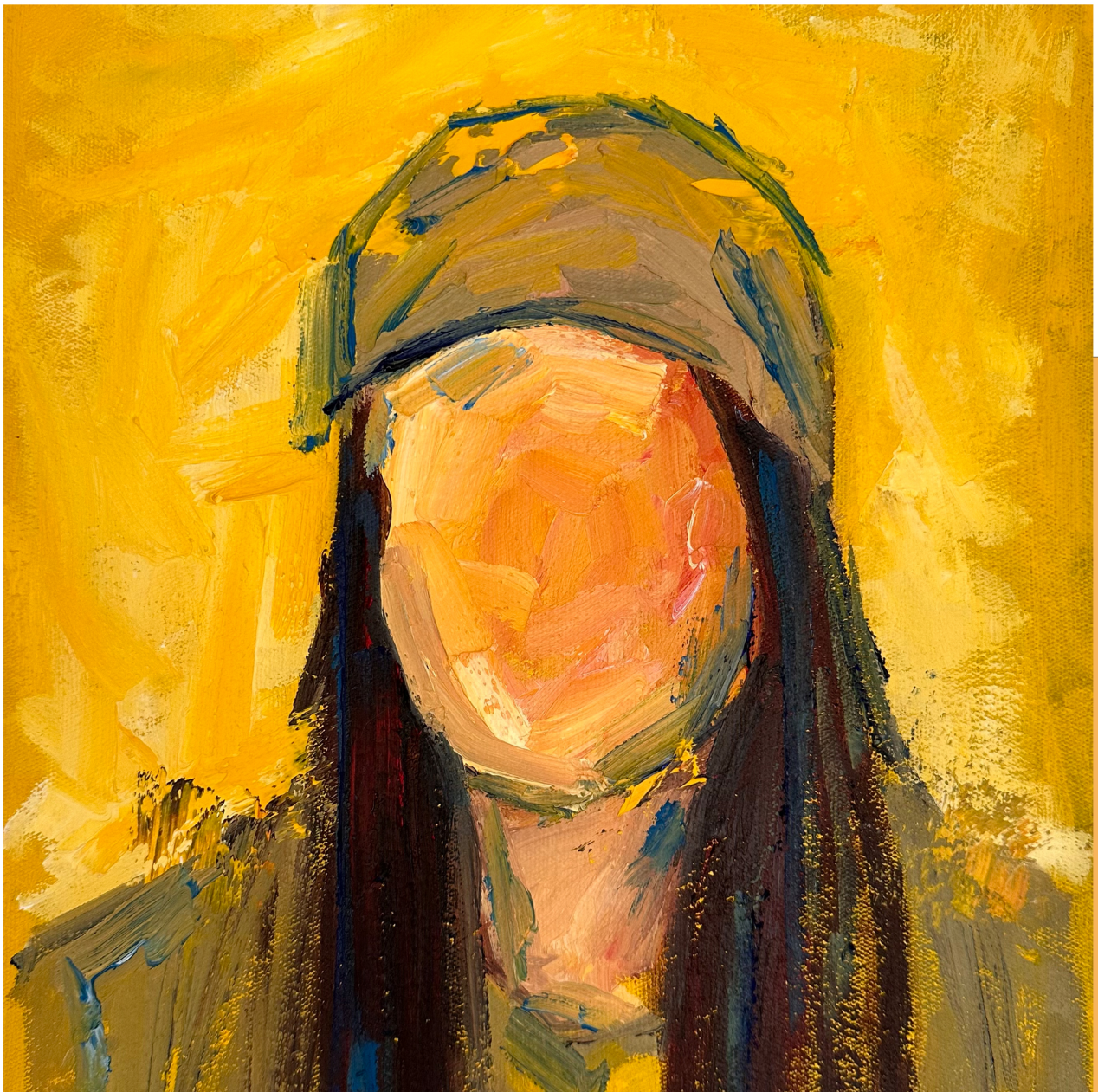


Elahé Niroumand





Artist Biography

Elahe Niroumand (born in 1987) is an Iranian artist working in the field of conceptual painting, with a focus on light, nature, and the exploration of the human inner world. Her works are often created in the heart of nature and reflect a blend of emotion, intuition, and human meaning.

She has been seriously pursuing painting for over nine years and began her artistic journey as a self-taught artist.

Before fully dedicating herself to the world of art, Elahe worked for ten years as a nurse and head nurse in the cardiac intensive care unit – an experience that deeply shaped the humanistic and spiritual perspective present in her paintings. In 2022, she made the conscious decision to leave her nursing profession to focus entirely on her art and personal creative path.

In her work, she strives to express the inner light of human beings, their connection to nature, and the deeper meanings of life through colors and forms.

Artist Statement

I am Elahe Niroumand – for me, painting is not merely art; it is a path back to the self.

Since childhood, I found peace in colors and crafts, but the environment I grew up in left little space for this passion to flourish. Life took me toward nursing, where I spent ten years serving the bodies and souls of others – a noble profession, yet far from the voice that kept crying out from within me.

During those years, I longed for the simplest moments – walking in the rain, reading by the window, wandering under the sun. These small joys became distant dreams.

But those longings gently pulled me back toward my inner light – a light that had been dimmed for too long.

In 2019, at the peak of an emotional crisis, I collapsed. Yet it was precisely there that a seed of awakening was planted.

From the depths of solitude and deep study on humanity, the meaning of life, art, and existence, I found myself again. I realized I was born to create –

To portray the inner world I had carried for so long – a world that was once dark and brown, but gradually became luminous through insight, experience, and awakening.

In 2022, I made the bold decision to leave my job and dedicate my life entirely to art.

Since then, nature has become my closest companion. I create my paintings in the heart of nature – where sunlight touches leaves, tree bark, and the face of the world.

That light is a reflection of the light within us.

A light that only needs to be seen, felt, and awakened.

☀️ My artworks are a journey to find that light – the one that exists even in our darkest hours, patiently waiting to be discovered.

The vivid and radiant colors in my paintings have become my language – a way to speak directly to the human heart.

Each painting is an intimate conversation –

A reminder that even in chaos, light can be seen, life can be reclaimed, and clarity can be restored.

Ultimately, my goal is not just to paint –

It is to remind you of this truth:

There is light within you. A light powerful enough to change the world.

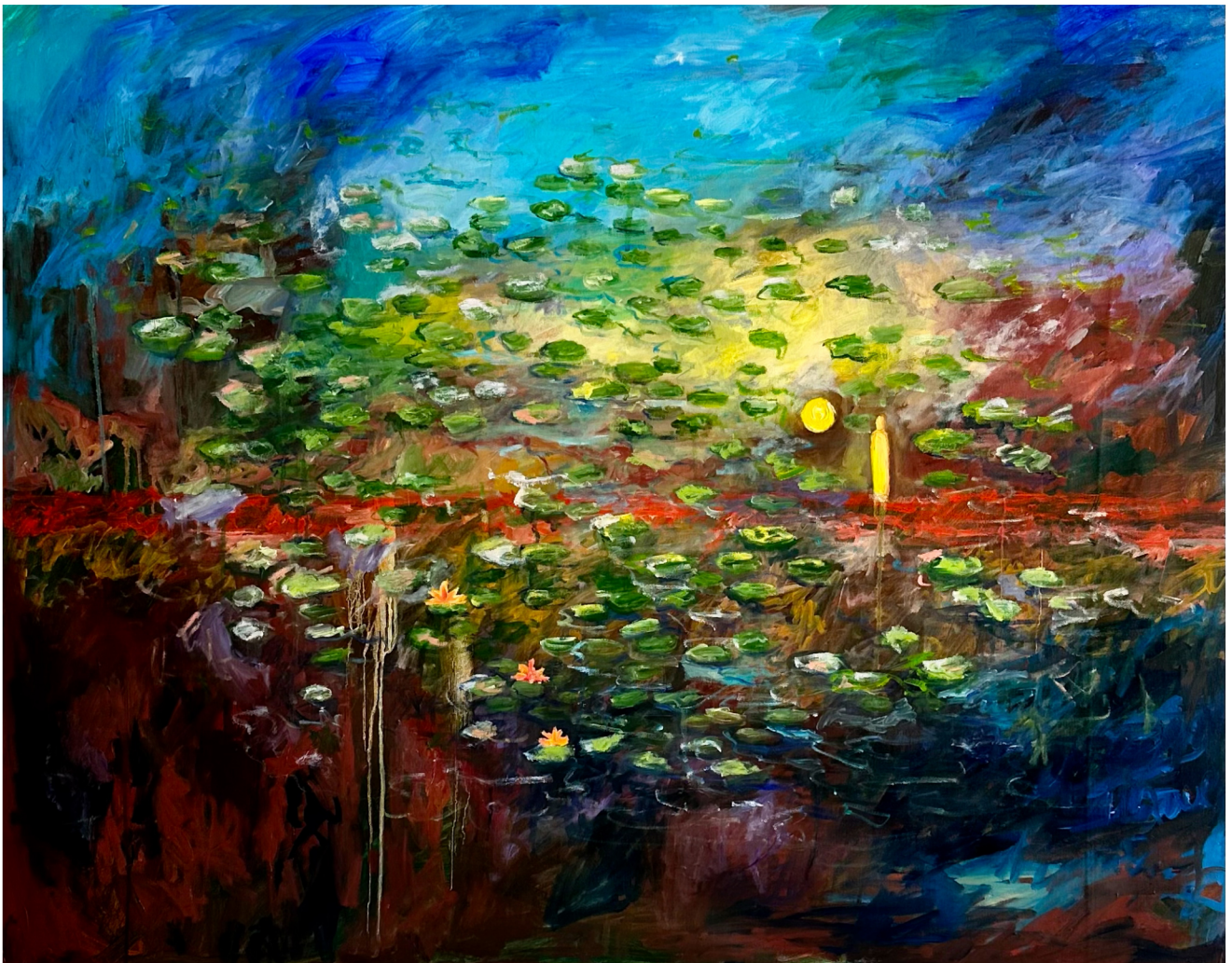
Golden Meadow

Amid the meadow and silence, under the golden sunlight, I rediscovered the feeling of happiness.

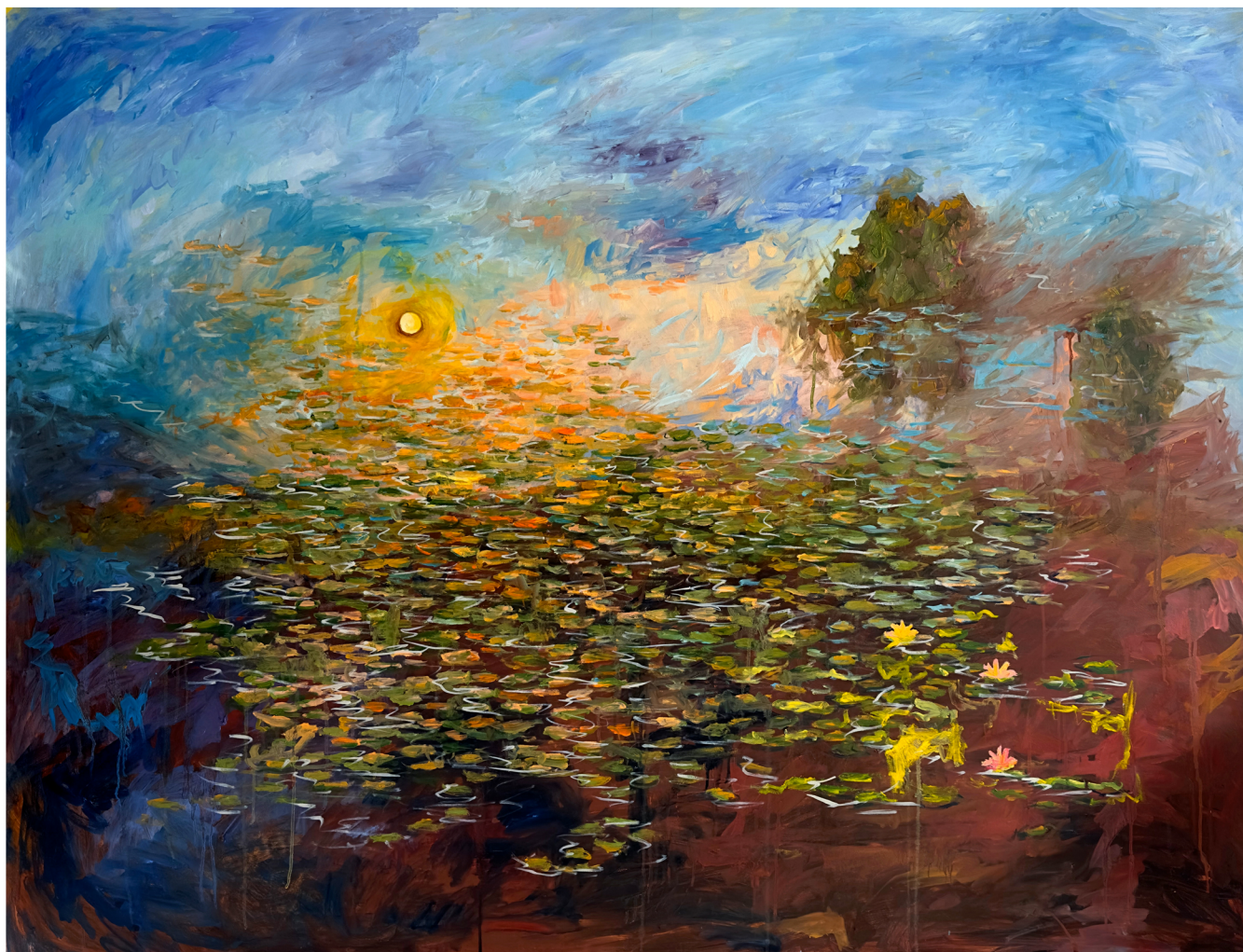
But suddenly, I was thrown back into the present – and that fleeting joy I transformed into blue lotuses blooms, amidst the swamp of life.
